

# Understanding Class of 2011 Graduation Requirements

The **Transcript** is a academic record for the school attended. Only final semester grades are reported on Huron’s High School Transcript. Marking Period and Progress Report grades are not reported on the transcript and may serve as “warnings” to raise your grades before the semester ends.

- **Course credit for Graduation!** Students may earn .5 credit for each class hour, each semester by passing a course with a minimum of a “D-“. Students who earn a “Z”, “E”, “H” or “I” have not earned credit in the course.
- Some courses require passing the state **HSCE exam** with a 70% or better, in addition to passing the course. If a passing grade was earned in the class and a failing grade earned on the HSCE test, a “Z” grade is provided. Students should have the opportunity to make up a “Z” grade with out having to take the entire semester over. For students who passed the course and the HSCE exam, the lowest possible passing/credit-earning grade is a “D-“.
- **GPA.** See page 23 of your 2008-2009 Student Services Guide to understand how gpa is calculated.
- Standardized “**test scores**” and “**record of attendance**” may also be requested with a transcript. Make sure you know what is requested and what you are sending.

### Additional Grad Requirement Info:

- 22 Credits total required for Graduation. = 16.5 compulsory + 5.5 elective (published wrong in SSG)
- Online Learning Experience – 20 hours. May be part of an another class or specific OL class
- There is NO Community Service Requirement for High School Graduation.

## Grade Level Placement

The following chart details the number of credits that must be earned to move up with your graduating class. If the minimum number of credits is not earned a student will be “retained” at the end of the school year. Students may move back up at any time after earning the requisite number of credits. Most students earn more credits than the minimum required for graduation.
