Schedule Changes

- You may make **any type of schedule change request ALL SUMMER!** However, **after Registration Day, only required changes** will be made.
- Priority of requests** as follows. . .
 - Required Changes: Failures, Summer School, Testing Out and Incomplete schedules
 - Required Changes: Wrong class level – Math, Language, English, Music, etc . . .
 - Required Changes: Dual (university), Split (enrollment split with another high school) or Work Experience
 - Other Stuff – requests are accepted, but not guaranteed to be completed!
- Your counselor may also need to adjust your schedule due to your course history and/or scheduling conflicts and will do so as needed. We will always make adjustments based on graduation requirements and your goals as discussed in the yearly interview.

Procedure:

- Contact your counselor in writing!** ie: e-mail, schedule change request form, leave message with counseling secretary or grade level secretary, etc. . . A parent signature is REQUIRED if you are dropping a graduation requirement, academic class, language, music ensemble or moving down an academic level.
- Request will be filled in order of **priority and chronological order of request.**
 - Summer Hours:** Your counselor will contact you if there is a question about your request and/or if it cannot be fulfilled. Otherwise, assume that we have been able to complete your request or are still working on it.
 - Registration Day:** You will be notified if there are any changes made to your schedule after Registration day.
- Pick up** completed schedule at **Registration Day**, end of August.

Graduation Requirements

Students may earn .5 credits for each class hour, each semester by passing a course with a minimum of a “D-“. Students who earn an “E”, “H” or “I” have not earned credit in the course.

- 22 Credits** total required for Graduation. = 16.5 compulsory + 5.5 elective (published wrong in SSG)
- Some courses require passing the state **HSCE exam** with a 70% or better, in addition to passing the course. For students who passed the course and the HSCE exam, the lowest possible passing/credit-earning grade is a “D-“.
- Online Learning Experience** – 20 hours. May be part of another class or specific OL class
- There is **NO Community Service Requirement** for High School Graduation.

Grade Level Placement

The following chart details the number of credits that must be earned to move up with your graduating class. If the minimum number of credits is not earned a student will be “retained” at the end of the school year. Students may move back up at any time after earning the requisite number of credits. Most students earn more credits than the minimum required for graduation.
